Peters Township Middle School is a National Blue Ribbon Award Winning School!



The U.S. Department of Education has named Peters Township Middle School as a National Blue Ribbon School. This year, 286 schools were designated as 2013 National Blue Ribbon Schools based on their overall academic excellence or for their success in closing achievement gaps. The Middle School was recognized among the highest performing public and private schools as measured by their performance on state assessments. A total of 15 schools in Pennsylvania were awarded this honor.

Character Counts At Peters Township Middle School!

Character Education is a cornerstone in Peters Township School District as well as in our community at large. The purpose of character education is to teach our students about core values such as respect, responsibility, honesty, compassion, and integrity.

The Middle School continues with the goals of fostering character development in our students by using the Seven Habits, the Eleven Principles of Effective Character Education, Project Wisdom, and by continuing to educate students on bullying and promote the use of antibullying strategies.

To recognize the importance of character education, the Middle School held its annual *Character Counts Week* from October 7th through 10th. This year's activity was focused on cooperation and teamwork. Each homeroom, as a team, designed a tshirt exemplifying what the middle school means to them. Some of the design themes emphasized ideas related to: character, Blue Ribbon Award, and the various activities here at the middle school.

The middle school's Character Counts Committee voted on the 37 homeroom designs, narrowing it down to 4 finalists, two 7th grade and two 8th grade homeroom designs. Students were then able to vote on the winning design during lunch.

Student Council rewarded the four finalists with a homeroom treat. The winning homeroom received a breakfast and their t-shirt design is featured on a long sleeve t-shirt available for students and faculty to purchase. STAR Team: Student Assistance Program



The Student Assistance Program (STAR Team) is a group process that helps students who are experiencing academic and/or behavioral difficulties that pose a barrier to their learning and success in school.

The STAR Team is comprised of a core group of caring professionals who are trained in student assistance and include: School Administrators, Teachers, Counselors, and Community Agency Liaisons.

The STAR Team gathers information in order to identify concerns, brainstorm solutions, and monitor progress to assist our students. They will make suggestions, implement strategies, and follow up as needed. The goal of the STAR Team is to work with you and other teachers and/or professionals who serve your child to assure his/her success.

All information discussed with the STAR Team is kept strictly confidential. If you think you child could benefit from the STAR Team program or to learn more about it, please contact you child's school counselor.

Online Bullying Report System

In an effort to help address bullying concerns at PTMS confidentially and more efficiently, an online reporting system has been instituted. The purpose of this reporting system is to help empower victims and bystanders to inform counselors and administration of bullying behaviors. It gives students and parents a way to confidentially communicate concerns. The goal of this system is to help create a safe school environment.

Hot Shots: After School Homework Help



Connecting with Your Child's School Counselor

Understand the expertise and responsibilities of your child's school counselor.

School counselors make a measurable impact in every student's life, assisting with academic, career and personal/social development. Professional school counselors are trained in both educating and counseling, allowing them to function as a facilitator between parents, teachers, and the student in matters concerning the student's goals, abilities, and any areas needing improvement. School counselors provide services not only to students in need, but to all students.



Discuss your child's challenges and concerns with the school counselor. As a parent, you know your child best. However, the school counselor can help you better understand your child as a student. It's important to encourage your child's expression of needs, hopes, and frustrations. School counselors are trained to help your children.

Learn about your child's school and social connections from the school counselor.

When you need information or assistance, your child's school counselor can help you get in touch with the appropriate school officials; learn about school policies on behavior, attendance, and dress; know the school calendar of important dates; and stay connected with the school in many other ways. The school counselor can also help you locate resources in the community when you need them.


Work with the school counselor to identify resources and find solutions to problems.

If your child is having a problem at school, it is important to work with your child's school counselor to find solutions. Discuss resources available within and outside of the school, and get information on how such programs can benefit your child. Your school counselor can be a valuable partner in your child's education and preparation for life beyond school.

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Who Do I Call in the Counseling Department?

You may sometimes wonder who to direct your question to in the School Counseling Office. The following are some helpful hints to direct your questions:



Our doors are always open to students throughout the day, every day.

Call Mrs. Cramer if:

- You feel your child needs referred for special education testing.
- You need a work permit for your child.
- You have any questions about extra-curricular activities or sports.
- You have questions about Power School and Power School passwords.



Call your child's grade level school counselor if:

- You feel your child may be having difficulty with an academic or personal/social issue.
- You have questions about scheduling.
- You have questions about high school and post-secondary planning.
- You need assistance finding help outside of school
- You need a list of available tutors.
